
MOU AS A CONSORTIUM OF DBHEI INSTITUTES

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To jointly organize conferences, workshops, seminars and other academic meetings.

To facilitate exchange of academic materials and information such as library facilities to members of faculty and students as per the prevailing rules and norms of the respective institute.



- To promote and provide skill development programs/trainings to the students and faculty members of the visiting institute from the host.
- To promote and provide student internships and placements by the host institution whenever possible.

The specific areas and details of cooperation within the framework of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) shall be discussed and agreed upon in writing by the appropriate authority of each Institution, prior to the initiation of any particular program or activity. No binding agreement between the Institutions shall exist unless and until such a formal written agreement is executed.

## Financial Implications

- In case of exchange of faculty/students/administrative staff between institutions, the host institution will see to the lodging and fooding expenses.
- Travel of the faculty/students/administrative staff will be seen by the guest institution or by the
  rule applied by the guest institution.
- In case of joint research projects, Financial arrangements for each specific collaboration will
  be decided on a case-to-case basis and brought on record in each case after due approval from
  heads of both the Institutions. Rules specific and as applicable to the funding agency will be
  applied at the time of the execution of such inter-institution activities.

The Institutions acknowledge that in the absence of any specific agreement to the contrary, all expenses of salary, travel, living and allied costs will be determined at the discretion and be the responsibility of the visitor's home Institution.

All visits of staff and the admission of students will be subject to compliance with entry/visa requirements of the two affiliating institutions involved, and the requirements of the two Institutions.

This MOU is a statement of intention between the institutions in relation to the areas of cooperation set out above. With the exception of the confidentiality obligations set out below, the Institutions do not intend for this to be legally binding.

Whilst this MOU creates no binding obligations on the institutions, the MOU shall become effective from the date of the last signature and remain in force for a period of FIVE (5) years with the understanding that it may be terminated by either Institution at any time by written notice to the other Institution (but the confidentiality obligations shall remain). Withdrawal from this MOU shall not affect any formal binding agreements already in place between the Institutions in relation to a specific program or activity.

The Institutions shall ensure that they keep all discussions and all information received by the other Institution in relation to this MOU or a proposed program or activity confidential, and not disclose the content of the discussions, or any proposed program or activity, to any third party.

Intellectual Property Rights: Rights regarding publications, patents, royalty, ownership of software/design/product developed etc., under the scope of this MOU, shall be decided by the two parties by mutual consent.

During the tenure of the MOU all institutes in this consortium shall maintain strict confidentiality and prevent disclosure of all the information and data exchanged under the scope of this MOU for any purpose other than in accordance with this MOU. All institutes in this consortium shall bind their respective personnel who come into possession or knowledge of any confidential information not to disclose the same to third parties without written approval of the disclosing party or use such confidential information for any use other than intended under this agreement or PROJECTS. Further all institutes in this consortium shall put in place adequate and reasonable measures to keep and store confidential information secure so as to prevent any unauthorized use.

to PARTIES collectively or severally, disclosed by the disclosing party under this agreement or any subsequent agreement, whether in writing, verbal or electronically, irrespective of the medium in which such information is stored, which is marked confidential or with any other words having similar meaning by the disclosing party, or specifically agreed to be kept confidential by the parties, or declared or identified so by the disclosing party before such disclosure or during the discussions. However confidential information shall not include any data or information which: (a) is or becomes publicly available through no fault of the receiving party, (b) is already in the rightful possession of the receiving party prior to its receipt of such data or information; (c) is independently developed by the receiving party without reference to the confidential information of the disclosing party (d) is rightfully obtained by the receiving party from a third party or is in the public domain (e) is disclosed with the written consent of the party whose information it is, or (f) is disclosed pursuant to court order or other legal compulsion, after providing prior notice to the disclosing party.

Amendments: Any amendment and/or addenda to the AGREEMENT shall be in writing and signed by the PARTIES hereto and shall only after such execution be deemed to form part of the AGREEMENT and have the effect of modifying the AGREEMENT to the extent required by such amendment or addenda.
