"I am a heavy alcoholic consuming 6 pegs daily, smoker with 25 cigarettes per day, Eat like a pig and no physical exercise."He only revealed these habits in one of his interviews. So in a way he had decided his own fate.In the process developed high blood sugar, had ESRD (End Stage Reanal Disease) and survived on HD (haemodialysis) till his ultimate demise. What is unfulfilled love, why is it so painful and how can you get over it?

Unfulfilled Love is the topic of many sad movies and love songs and with so many of us experiencing at some point of time or another. It's no wonder why loving someone who doesn't love you back hurts more than a break up but it's less talked about of heart breaks. Unfulfilled love is basically love you have for someone that isn't returned back. This can mean someone you're not with but you want to be with or it can also happen in a relationship that has become one-sided.

When you love someone who doesn't feel the same way, it can be confusing to understand why, particularly if you've expressed your affection - which can make things even more frustrating. If we have such strong feelings for someone else it may be hard to understand why they don't feel the same way about us. This type of love can also lead to feelings of rejection, which can make you doubt yourself and think you've done something wrong. This can really take a toll on your self-esteem. "People will often blame themselves for why they're not getting reciprocated love,". I often hear things like, 'I'm not good enough, if only I was prettier or smarter they would be able to commit or show me love, and this can also create a lot of anxiety. We are chasing after something which we will be never able to reach. So we have feelings of loss which are the same as grief, "It hurts to mourn the loss of someone, whether a romantic relationship that never even started, or reaching the end of the road with a long term partner,"

Just like getting over a breakup, it's possible to get over unfulfilled love too. When you're wrapped up in how you feel about someone, it can be hard to see things from their point of view. But looking at things from a more positive perspective can be helpful, "This will allow you to be kind to yourself, knowing that there are other factors influencing what's going on; you are not being loved is not just because you're a terrible person."If you love someone from a far, you've probably created an idealised version of them - but it can help to see them for who they really are. Doing this will help you see their flaws and work towards knowing that they aren't the best person for you, If you're in a situation where your love isn't returned, set boundaries about the kind of commitment you expect. "The key to that is, if they can't meet your boundary, then you have to walk away," At the end of the day, our experiences make us who we are. Learning from unfulfilled love will help you to know yourself better, and to have a better idea of the love and care you deserve - which can only be a good thing.

To burn with desire and keep quiet about it is the greatest punishment we can bring on ourselves. There is nothing worse than knowing you want something, besides knowing you can never have it.

MISUSE OF WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Till date you have read my articles regarding friendship and love but in this article I would like to divert your kind to major problem faced and impacts on men in today's time due to various women centric laws in our country. Women-centric laws are made to benefit women who are considered as an oppressed section of the society. But there is a need to see these laws from a different perspective. These laws are affecting the rights of the males who are being harassed by false charges against them. The role of the judiciary is to provide justice to every individual and there can be no discrimination between men and women.

Now a days a young man's sucide is talk of the town and local news channels. He committed suicide after a week of proving innocent from the charge of domestic violence. When he was arrested there was not enough proofs against him but to get a women justice and to establish that the women-centric laws are for the protection of the females he was arrested. But after returning back life was not the same for him. He lost his job, people around him still treated him like a criminal and made sarcastic remarks against him. He was unable to bear this and gave up on his life. The simple question is whether the laws made to protect women possess the right to kill an innocent person? The laws are made to protect every individual. Considering women as the weaker and oppressed section of the society various laws were developed to protect them. But today, many of those laws are being misused. The laws which are mostly misused are Section 498-A and Section 376 of Indian Penal Code.

Section 498-A of IPC deals with the subjugation of women to cruelty by her husband or her in-laws. It is a non-bailable, cognizable (the police officer can arrest without warrant) and non-compoundable (a complaint cannot be compounded just by withdrawing the case but has to be quashed by the High Court) offence. When the woman or her relative's file complaint in the police station, an action is taken against the husband immediately. The husband, along with his family members, can be put behind the bars for 3 years and be fined. But in IPC there is no law against cruelty towards men. There are several women who are capable of subjecting men to cruelty. The tears of females are visible to everyone but no one sees the tears of men. There are so many false cases of domestic violence being lodged and innocent people are being put behind the bars. The family of the husband too is arrested in most of the cases and has to face humiliation in the society.

Section 304-B of IPC is a provision made to protect the women from cruelty by her husband and in-laws for dowry. It is presumed that if a woman dies within seven years of her marriage and her husband or in-laws were demanding dowry, then they will be responsible for her sudden death. This provision protects women but what about men. There is no such rule that if a husband dies within seven years of marriage the wife can be held liable. The law should be such that which protects the rights of each and everyone in the society and not only the females. There should be proper enquiry about the reason of the death and not directly putting the blame on the husband and his family.

Whenever there is discussion regarding sexual assault the first thing which comes to mind is women as the victim and men as the assailant and this is where the basic problem lies. Section 375 of IPC which was enacted to help the women to get justice if they are forced into sexual activities is also being misused. A man is not given any protection.




